From September 7 to 9, 1984, a working meeting of former astronauts and cosmonauts from the United States, the Soviet Union and France was held near Paris. Attending the meeting from the U.S. were, Donn Eisele (Apollo 7), Dr. Edgar Mitchell (Apollo 14), Russell L. Schweickart (Apollo 9), from France was Jean-Loup Chretien (Soyuz T-6), and from the USSR were Alexei Leonov (Voskhod 2, ASTP), Dr. Oleg Makarov (Soyuz 12, Soyuz 27, Soyuz T-3), Yuri Romanenko (Soyuz 26, Soyuz 38). The meeting had been preceded by several years of preparation. During the meeting the group expressed a common desire for regular contacts among persons who are bound together by their shared experience in space flight.

Acknowledging their concern for the future of humanity and recognizing opportunities for cooperation the participants expressed their determination to use the privilege of their unique experience to promote the development of space and the use of space technology for the benefit of all people.

Because of the specific nature of their experience space explorers are aware of the need for international cooperation in the peaceful development and exploration of space for promoting resolution of major scientific, technical and humanitarian issues.

On this basis the working group decided to establish an organization of people who have traveled in space. The purpose of the organization will be to explore and promote constructive uses of space for enhancing the quality of life around the planet and to provide a positive view of the future for generations to come; to promote the establishment of broader contacts among people who have flown in space and to identify opportunities for cooperation and issues of common concern.

There exists today a small group of privileged people who have had the direct opportunity to leave the planet and look backat it from space. For many of us this experience has had a strong impact on our thinking and outlook. For many people around the world the photographic record of this experience, in combination with wha we have had to say about it, has altered their understanding of mankind's relationshipto and responsibility for the planet and its environment. Many thoughtful people believe that mankind's use of space will be high on the list of factors shaping the Earth's future. One need only look at the use of space in the communication and information fields today to exemplify this point.

Very few people in today's connected world are unaware of or untouched by space technology; whether directly through the use of comminication satellites or by vicariously sightseeing aboard Voyager or Venera or their companions on their passage through the solar system. Clearly we are only at the beginning of the space age. Technologies which are emerging today from laboratories and drafting rooms are opening capabilities which will dwarf current accomplishments in both scope and importance. They run the gamut from Space Colonies drawing their sustenance from extraterrestrial materials and solar energy, to outposts on Mars and the satellites of the outer planets, to the powerful weapons of science fiction, both offensive and defensive.

All of us understand that the world is shrinking; we are becoming, through our technologies and common needs, a highly interactive global society. are all totally dependent on the planetary environmental systems to sustain our very existence.

Ironically, it is the very same technology which allows us to grapple with global environmental challenges and plan for fantastic and visionary futures which also permits, through misuse or miscalculation, the total destruction of civilization and perhaps all human life. And unfortunately, almost the whole world is focussed on the negative possibilities, TO THE VIRTUAL EXCLUSION OF ANY POSITIVE VISION. Without a vision of the future, an image of hope, a possibility to strive toward, there is a diminished likelihood of it occuring. This vision of a positive future, a cooperative, planetary, life enhancing future is the challenge which we who have seen the planet from space, using the technology which can make it possible must address.

No group of people has had the privilege or the first hand experience of seeing this planet of ours as a single, beautiful, life supporting home, save us; the Astronauts and Cosmonauts, a small group of space explorers.

Many have seen the photographs, and many may be more articulate or more wise than we. None, however, but we can speak and act from the direct experience of being outside of and looking back on the single home of all the life we know of in the universe. And few command more public attention and respect for what they have done, whether deserved or not.

CHARTER

ORGANIZATIONAL MEASURES

I. Membership

At the initial stage citizens of the ISSR, USA, and France who have been in space can become members of the Association. Subsequently persons meeting the qualifications whho are from other countries could become associated with the work of the Association.

2. Where Congresses will be Held and their Periodicity.

Congresses will be held every year on the territory of countries with space programs, or otherd which have expressed the desire to organize such congresses.

3. Financial Aspects.

The conduct of congresses be on the basis of exchange and will not involve any hard currency expenditure. Congresses will be financed by the receiving side (transportation is financed independently).

4. Leading Organs.

During the first stage of the activity of the Congress two cochairmen are to be elected from the Soviet and American sides. The activities of the Congress between sessions will be coordinated by a consultative group consisting of one or two representatives of each participating country.

5. Representation at the Congress.

Up to five representatives from among the cosmonauts of each participating country.

6. Adoption of Decisions at Congresses.

All decisions are adopted at Congresses by consensus.

7. Ties with Other International Organizations

Any press release, appeal, or other concluding documents adopted at a Congress are to be sent to the UN, Unesco, the UN Geneva committee on disarmament, and other international organizations whichseek to establish contact with the association.

8. Press Contact

Meetings of the Congress are to be confidential. At the conclusion of a Congress a press conference is held forrepresentatives of the press at which a joint press release is issued at this conference; other materials of the Congress can be distributed with the common agreement of the participants.

Symbols.

A permanent emblem and a device of the Planetary Congress of space explorers /researchers are to be established.
